NAPLAN TESTING

Next week our year 3 and 5 students will do a series of online tests in Literacy and Numeracy as part of the National Assessments Program of Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN). These tests are completed every year for students in years 3, 5, 7 and 9 in all states and territories across the country. With this data, states are able to compare how well they have gone, as well as looking at various cohorts of students and of course schools and parents are provided with individual student data.

We can also measure the growth students have made from one test to the next, or see areas that might need more work in the future.

The tests will be across several days at particular times and involve Reading, Writing, Spelling, Grammar and Mathematics. This year the NAPLAN tests are earlier than usual and will mostly be done online. Parents will receive a report on how their child went in each area, which comes to the school for collection. We wish for all our year 3 and 5 students to do their very best.



At school all behaviour is tracked and monitored through our school wide system. The chart below identifies for all children, families and staff which behaviours are deemed a major or a minor behaviour. At WWCC we adjust the follow up for each behaviour based on its category. This may include re teaching the expectation, developing a social story or having a restorative conversation for minor behaviours. The school tracks all the incidents in the playground and classrooms and develops adjustments to our routines and teaching based on patterns observed within the school data over a period of time. This may include teaching additional lessons on the behaviours in our Matrix or developing whole school routines for students and teachers to follow e.g. our line up routines currently being taught across the school.



In the Kindergarten

The children have been using many different types of small construction building sets and threading activities. These types of activities are designed to help children strengthen their fine motor skills. The term fine motor skills, is the coordination of small muscles in the fingers and hands to make movements. Picking up, positioning and carefully piecing together the construction set assists the development of these small muscles. These skills are required to enhance a child's ability to hold and control a pencil and write fluently.



The children have also started to form friendships together and increase their interactions with other children. Many children are constantly using the Zones of Regulation phrases within their play or when interacting with others. Each day the children are becoming more familiar with these zones which is helping them to express their needs within the kinder. 

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments;** your child has started or changed schools this year.
- **changed family circumstances;** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.





eCanteen

Online canteen management software

eCanteen is an online order processing system for schools. It can be used on any device without the need for installation. It is mobile compatible as a free simple app installed from the website without any need of an app store.

The eCanteen online ordering system is designed with parents in mind. Many of its features are designed to make the process of ordering from the canteen convenient and simpler for parents of students. These features include:



Simple login

Login with a Facebook, Google or Microsoft Account to cut down on having to remember yet another login. Don't have one of these, don't worry it's easy to sign up to one of these providers for free.

Manage your own students

Your account allows you to create profiles for multiple students across multiple schools (should those schools be using the eCanteen online ordering system). This stores the details of your students and allows you to process orders for one or more children in a single transaction, rather than having to place individual orders for each student.

Order up to a week in advance

Not only does eCanteen allow you to order for multiple students, it also allows for you to place all your orders for the current week. Cut off times are set by your school's canteen, so please check to make sure you complete your order for a day before the cut off time.

Repeat Orders

Easily access previous orders to copy them into a new order, cutting down on time taken to complete your orders.

Easy, secure payment

All payments are processed by PayPal. PayPal is a trusted payment processing site which gives you security in knowing your details are securely stored, so you don't have to enter them every time. PayPal allows you to use either a credit card or bank account and keeps a record of all payments made.

Getting Started

Register Your Account

To use eCanteen you need to register an account and login. To do this you can use an existing Facebook, Google or Microsoft account. You will need to provide eCanteen with your First Name, Last Name, Email Address and Phone Number so that the school can contact you if there are any problems with your order.

Create Profiles

Once you have logged in you need to create a profile to be able to make order. A profile can be created for a Student or School Staff Member. When you create a profile, you must provide the First Name and Last Name of the student or staff member and select their school. Your school may also require you to provide student code, home group, teacher or room. You can have as many profiles linked to your account as you need, with each profile being able to be link to a different school as needed.

Placing an Order and Checking Out

Now you can place an order for each of your profile. Click the new order button and add items to your order by clicking the select button. You can add multiple items by clicking the plus button. After clicking the save button you will return to see all your selected items. You can order for multiple profiles across multiple days of the week in one transaction. 

Who is eligible for the \$250 Power Saving Bonus?

The \$250 Power Saving Bonus is available to all Victorian households. To be eligible for the \$250 Power Saving Bonus, Victorian households will need to:

- Have a recent residential electricity bill
- Be the account holder for that bill
- Visit the Victorian Energy Compare website (compare.energy.vic.gov.au) or engage with an energy affordability service through one of our participating community outreach partners.

Will the \$250 Bonus be deducted from my electricity bill?

No, the Bonus will be paid to your nominated bank account via Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) or Bank Cheque.

I received payments through previous rounds of the Power Saving Bonus Program, can I apply for the new \$250 Power Saving Bonus?

Yes, if you received payments under previous rounds of the Power Saving Bonus Program you are still eligible to apply for the new round that is commencing on 24 March 2023, provided you meet the eligibility requirements.

Can my household apply for the \$250 Power Saving Bonus more than once?

Only one payment per household is available for each round of the Power Saving Bonus program. If you have applied for a \$250 Power Saving Bonus under the current round of the program, which opened on 1 July 2022, you are not able to receive another payment under this round of the program. A new round of the Power Saving Bonus Program will commence on 24 March 2023. From that date, all eligible Victorian households will be able to apply for another \$250 payment under the


